Read James 1:22-25

- What is James referring to when he says "the word" or "perfect law"?
- What should our response be?
- What promises are we given if we listen to the Word?

What do you think it means when PETRA asks, "Who do you listen to?"

What other voices are telling you how you should live your life?

Read the parable in Matthew 7:24-27

 What is in store for us if we don't listen and respond to God's Word in every area of our lives?

It's hard sometimes to listen to what God's Word says about life. So why does it seem so much easier for others?

Read Hebrews 4:2

- What element was missing to some who also heard?
- How would you define the word "faith" as it relates to everyday decision making?
- In what areas is this easy for you?
- In what areas is this difficult for you?

Faith as it relates to life could perhaps best be defined as a confidence that God's Word is reliable and that it can be trusted. That trust in turn reshapes our thinking as we express our trust in God by acting on His Word and putting it into practice.

God never promises that our lives will get easier as we trust Him and try to live our lives to please Him.

Read Matthew 16:24

- · What are we told to do?
- What does the cross signify?
- · How would you phrase this verse in modern terms?

In our culture we think that "to follow" means to put ourselves in a secondary position. In Bible times the streets were so narrow that two people walking together had to go single file. "To follow" simply means to go with.

In that case, where is Jesus as we're facing all of our decisions and temptations?

Read Genesis 1:27-28 & Genesis 2:24-25

- Who created sex and why?
- Do you think that it's possible for God not to approve of something that He has created?
- What is the proper context for sex?

Have you ever wondered why God is so in favor of sex between married people, yet still gives so many negative commandments in the Bible regarding sex? Could it be that our confusion here comes from misunderstanding what God is teaching? Never does God tell us that the proper use of sex (sex within marriage) is wrong, only the misuse (outside of marriage).

Why do you think that God gave us a sex drive, then, all through the Bible, forbids us to act on it?

Maybe God's greatest motivation is not to keep us from having fun, but to create for us the greatest opportunity for a love, marriage and sexual relationship. God's commandments are there to protect us and to provide for us.

Summary:

There are a lot of people who would like to tell you how you should live your life, what type of clothes you should wear, how you should act etc. But the only source of information that is truly in our best interest is that which comes from God and His word. Sex is a wonderful gift from God, and is meant to be enjoyed, but within the loving commitment of marriage. True love can never be replaced with sex. There is a whole world out there that would like you to change your standards, and are confusing the intimacy of love with the intensity of sex. Just remember that God's plan is best, and you are worth waiting for!

Then as you got older you started to understand that mom and dad weren't so crazy after all. All those years of restrictions and cold, hard rules are making a lot more sense to you now as you find out they really had your best interest at heart.

Perhaps that's the way it is with God too. All the "do's and don'ts" seem harder to deal with because we're adults now. But it all comes down to a matter of trust. Just as we trusted mom and dad when we were young, we need to trust God now as "spiritual babes" (I Peter 2:2). Let's face it, we still have a lot to learn.

According to I Peter 5:7, what is God's real motivation behind all the restrictions?

Do you ever feel alone in your struggles? Like no one really cares about you? Maybe you feel like you're the only one in the world who is dealing with your type of problems?

With these questions in mind, read God's promises in Matthew 11:28-30 & I Corinthians 10:12-13, and answer the following questions:

- · What is meant by yoke and temptation?
- What is your biggest area of temptation in trying to live a life that is pleasing to God?
- Do you think anyone else has this same temptation?
- According to these verses, has God equipped you to handle the pressure? How will you?
- Has God proven Himself faithful to you in the past? When was that?

There is a lot of hurt that can happen when we get outside of God's will for our life. There are a lot of risks that we take when we try to live life on our own - typically we call those risks consequences. With mom and dad it was a slap on the hand or the behind, but it seems that now the risks are greater.

Consider for a moment what can happen if we step out of God's design for sex. What are some of the:

- Spiritual Risks?
 Physical Risks?
- Emotional Risks?
 Relational Risks?

P.I.D. uses the phrase "We just met, we can't do that yet!"
Knowing ahead of time (before the temptation) how you will respond to the temptation is what is called conviction.

Read Daniel 1:8 & Genesis 39:7-12

- Did Joseph stop to "prayerfully consider" what he should do? What was his response?
- Do you have that strong of convictions in any area of your life? Which?
- · Which area do you struggle with the most?
- Take a moment to write out your convictions regarding your sexuality. What are your expectations?

So where does all this leave us? What is it that God really expects of us? We need to realize that we can't be perfect but that doesn't mean that we shouldn't try our best. After all that God has done for us the least we can give Him is our very best.

Summary:

Temptation in our life is real! But God through His wisdom provides a means of escape. When we yield or get out of line with God's will, there are consequences that we must face. The emotional, physical, spiritual and relational risks are very much a part of daily living, and oftentimes very painful. God never expects us to be perfect, for He knows that we can't be. He just calls us to be faithful and in so doing to be a witness to others by living a life that is truly pleasing to God.
